Empey flew Spitfires and P-51 Mustangs in WWII over the skies of Europe, and became an ace. I even built a paper scale model of his P-51B Mustang back in July. A very jolly person, Lt. Empey was a member of the American Fighter Aces Association, San Antonio chapter, and there I enjoyed his stories and jokes when he talked about his adventures in Europe and Viet Nam. The last time I saw him, about a month ago, he told me he was a distant cousin of Willy Messerschmitt on his mother's side, as her surname was Messerschmitt. He even went to see the prodigious designer in Germany after the war, and had a very good time with him (Willy was building cars by that time, and Lt.



Lt. James Empey passed away on November 21 at his home in Universal City, where he lived with his wife.

1. President Jerry Escobedo opened the meeting, his first as president following the departure of former president Dee Jacobs. **Tom Sprawls** was appointed to succeed Jerry as vice president and **Lee Forbes** remained as incumbent treasurer. Only the president and the treasurer have check writing authority on the Club's bank account.

2. Lee Forbes gave a presentation on various **options for storing**, **shipping and transporting plastic models**. He demonstrated various methods of protecting models, including low-quality pile carpet, toilet paper and using a "box within a box" system that will protect even delicate models for shipping. He also showed a custom-made plastic tool box with layers of pile carpet shelves for transporting models.

3. Jerry asked if the members were still interested in having a build night on the third Thursday of the month since few members have been supporting this event in recent months. Members indicated that the time of 6 to 8 p.m. wasn't long enough and that getting to HobbyTown USA at 6 p.m. was too difficult because of rush hour traffic. Our first 2014 Adult Building Class is planned to start at HobbyTown USA on the first or second Saturday of January from 1 to 4 p.m. for six or more weeks, so it was decided that we should combine the two events to see if there is any interest in a "Build Afternoon." In the meantime the current Thursday build night will be suspended effective immediately.

4. Next, Jerry asked if there was any interest in selecting a "Club Challenge" theme for members to build models to be entered in the ModelFiesta 33 Club/Group Category 415. The response was a little underwhelming and no themes were suggested. However, one member was already working on a 1/48 scale **Korean War Aircraft Collection** and if anyone wanted to join him in that effort, that collection could be entered in the Club/Group Category if multiple modelers are involved.

5. Kent Knebel, ModelFiesta 33

contest director, provided a short report and indicated that the MF 33 Flyer had been distributed to local hobby shops and that a quarter page ad for MF 33 had been reserved for inclusion in the next IPMS/USA Journal prior to our show.

6. Lee Forbes, treasurer, provided an oral financial report for the month ending October 31 and provided details on a type of banking account that would be more appropriate for the organization based on our club status. This led to a lively discussion, resulting in a general consensus to **support closing the club's existing bank account and opening a new account as briefed by Lee**. It was also requested that Lee provide a report on the projected profit /loss for the year 2013 at the next meeting.

7. Lee asked if there was any interest in putting up a last minute display at the November 9 Pioneer Air Museum Fall Airshow and Fly-In at the Old Kingsbury Aerodrome in Kingsbury, TX. There was no interest in

participating this year.

8. Lee asked if anyone wanted to participate in putting on a display at the Dolph Briscoe Middle School Veterans Day celebration as we have in the past, if we're invited again this year. Jerry volunteered since he lives in that area of town.

9. Jerry presented awards to the winners of the October open contest and conducted the Quarterly "Frankenstein" theme contest. There was only one entry, Lee Forbes' 1/72 scale Me-410 A-2/U4. This model was originally released by FROG in the mid-1970s and "returned from the dead" in 1993 as a Revell of Germany kit. Congrats to Lee on his win!

10. Jerry conducted the "Show-N-Tell" and took photos of the Quarterly Contest winner and all of the "Show-N-Tell" participants.

11. Jerry asked for volunteers to sign up for future demos or modeling techniques seminars, or providing a guest speaker. More to follow on this issue.

12. The meeting was dismissed.
