1/72 scale. The kit is an excellent representation of the Hornet, and requires little in the way of aftermarket parts. The only additions I made were an aftermarket resin seat from True Details, and MK. 20 Rockeye cluster bombs sourced from Hasegawa's weapons set. The decals are from Repli-scale. Construction was otherwise straight forward, and from the box. The model is finished with a combination of Polly Scale and Tamiya paints, and weathered with oil washes, pastels, and airbrush shading.

The MiG-29A is from Italeri. Though more basic than the F/A-18 kit, it builds into the most accurate representation of the type available in 1/72 scale. The only addition to this build was a resin aftermarket seat, again from True Details. Markings were again sourced from Repli-scale on their excellent export MiG-29 sheet; stencil decals were from the kit.



Much like the Hornet, painting was accomplished using a combination of Polly Scale and Tamiya acrylics, with similar weathering using washes, pastels and airbrush shading. I did some fading to the paint to replicate that which occurs in the desert sun.

**The two models** were displayed on simple wooden bases from Michaels's, with a painted carrier deck for the Hornet, and a Verlinden printed airfield for the MiG-29.

**Thanks Joe,** for that informative write-up. As you guys know, there is NO theme for the December meeting. That's because it is our annual

Christmas Party, and also our Annual Favorite Five Contest. This is my favorite contest, because it is voted upon by you, our fellow club members.
