

If the entrance to the Monterey Maritime Museum looks just like the bow of a ship, there's a good reason for that. The whole structure was christened the S.S. Piedmont, after the passenger ferry that sailed the waters of the northern California coast.

The building itself is light and airy and holds a considerable amount of sailing and fishing memorabilia. First of all, the museum is set in the remains of what was once "cannery row" during the

heyday of the California fishing industry in the 1940s. A lot of the exhibits hark back to those days. There are cannery displays, equipment and scale models

all over the place. Chinese junks, gunboats, barges, tugs and steam boats are all there too, plus a display with a full-scale mock-up of the captain's quarters.

You'll also find some very intricate dioramas. For instance, the "Monterey

Boatworks" diorama seems pretty accurate.

Some of these models represent at least 1/12 scale. And the rigging on the sailboats is spectacular.

One of the coolest items in the museum is about

seven feet wide and takes up two floors of space: The Fresnel lens dates back to the late 1800s.

You can get through the entire place in 1-1/2 hours. Great stuff.




















































































### DIPLOMATIC TIES WITH NEW MODELERS AND OUR SERVICEMEN

After a one-year hiatus, the iHobby Expo returned to the Chicagoland area this year. iHobby is one of the largest expositions showing all types of hobbies - R/C, plastic models and trains, just to name a few. Vendors from all across the industry were in attendance showcasing their products and giving the public sneak peeks at what they have in store for the hobbyist. The vendors were a virtual "who's who" of the industry - Iwata, Testors, Vallejo, Sveda, Eduard, Moebius, Revell/Monogram, Excel Tools and numerous others specializing in everything from model trains to R/C planes and everything in-between.

Previous expositions were held at the Donald E. Stephens Convention Center in Rosemont, and last year's event was held in Ohio. This year's expo took place at the Schaumburg Convention Center during the weekend of Oct. 5-6. The venue may be new, but the excitement was the same as in years past. I am once again happy to announce that the Butch O'Hare Club's presence was well-evident throughout the weekend. We had no less than 10 members show up to assist future model builders with the Make 'N Take area.

For those of you who are not familiar with this program, it provides kids of all ages the opportunity to sit down and build a model and then take the completed model with them – hence the name Make 'N Take. The club members were there to provide the kids with as much or as little assistance as they required. Iwata Airbrush generously donated several airbrushes to the area so that anyone who completed a model and wanted to try airbrushing had the opportunity to do just that.

All in all, the weekend was loud, chaotic, busy, and at times never-ending, but those involved walked away with a sense of accomplishment. Most of these kids may only build another model at next year's expo, but who knows? If even one, just one, of those kids gets hooked on our hobby, then it was worth the effort. So I would like to thank all of the Butch O'Hare members who gave up their time, and a hearty congratulations to our own John Bishop for taking home the first-place blue ribbon for his PT boat.









It's our hobby, and we will only get out of it what we put into it. Speaking of which, the club was recently contacted by the local couple who last year donated that huge collection of models. They wanted to donate more model kits from their collection. Once again, the donation consisted of several hundred models from all the major manufacturers and in all scales and sizes armor, planes, helicopters, trucks, cars and ships. As with the previous donation, the donors have requested the kits be distributed to local organizations that assist both active duty military personnel and veterans groups. The kits will be sent to the Wounded Warrior Project, the Support the Troops program through the IPMS Eagle Squadron, the local chapter of the Marine Corps League and the USO out of Midway Airport. These organizations all assist both active duty and retired military personnel.

A wise man recently told me that part of this hobby, and maybe the most enjoyable part, is collecting the model kits that each of us is determined to build. More often than not, they simply wind up as part of a gray army – relegated to collecting dust while sitting on the "my next project" shelf. So why not put those kits to good use and donate them? The club will continue to accept donations of kits for our veterans, and I am hoping to expand the outreach in the future. Our veterans have given so much for us so that we can simply enjoy our everyday freedoms – why not give a little back? If you enjoy reading our newsletter, thank a teacher. If you are reading it in English, then thank a vet.

Still not convinced? Then check out these pictures of some of the recipients of donated kits as well as this year's donation. Isn't it worth a kit that will more than likely never be assembled, to put a smile on a soldier's, marine's, airman's or sailor's face? Or the face of a child who gets to build a model with his or her military parent?
