But wait just a minute! That's not really why we created the show and tell table! Years back, it was created to bring some of the in-progress pieces to the front of the room, along with tools and resources members wished to share, and yes, even the exciting new scores. But over the years it's evolved into almost exclusively a "this just in" exhibit.

So the second new thing I'm going to try is a club reporter, who will poke around during the meeting to ask some simple questions about anything he finds interesting and prepare little blurbs in the newsletter about what he has learned. So please be cooperative with the club reporter (I intend this to not be the same person all the time, so as to get a variety of styles and perspectives over the year); answering a couple simple questions for someone else to write up should be something that any of us can do easily.

So while we continue to celebrate our completions and learn from the formal presentations in 2014, let us also share with our fellow club members the journey: the steps we take to build our models, the progress we've made, the lessons learned. Let's encourage each other in the coming year by partaking in the more friendly and "community" aspects of our hobby.

This month's model contest theme is "Operation Desert Storm" -- the war in the deserts of Iraq and Kuwait in 1991. Build any US and coalition or Iraqi subject in any scale.

In January 1991 in response to the Iraqi invasion and annexation of Kuwait, the US and a coalition of 34 nations launched a campaign to free Kuwait and defeat the military forces of Saddam Hussein. The aerial campaign commenced on January 17, 1991 followed by a ground assault on February 24th. The coalition ceased their advance and declared a cease fire 100 hours after the ground campaign started.

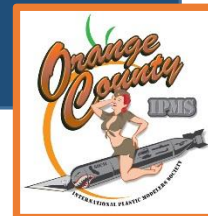
The nickname "Video Game War" was used to describe this conflict as a result of the daily broadcast of images of coalition air strikes on Iraqi targets and the use of an array of "smart weapons" on an on-going basis.

The possibilities for this month's contest are many and varied. Any US-coalition or Iraqi aircraft-vehicle-ship or other subjects (can you say Scud missile or cruise missile) in any scale will work for your entry. See you on January 17th and good luck to all. I would love to see one of these entered this month: 1) a US war-fighter figure wearing a NBC suit; 2) a diorama of a burning Kuwait oil well; 3) an Iraqi mobile field kitchen vehicle (mistaken for a WMD platform).

The January IPMS/OC Model Contest has an extra competition --The Best of the Year 2013 Models. The Monthly Theme and Judges Choice winners from 2013 will vie for the Best of 2013 Theme Award and Best of 2013 Judges Choice Award so bring your models in for this special contest.

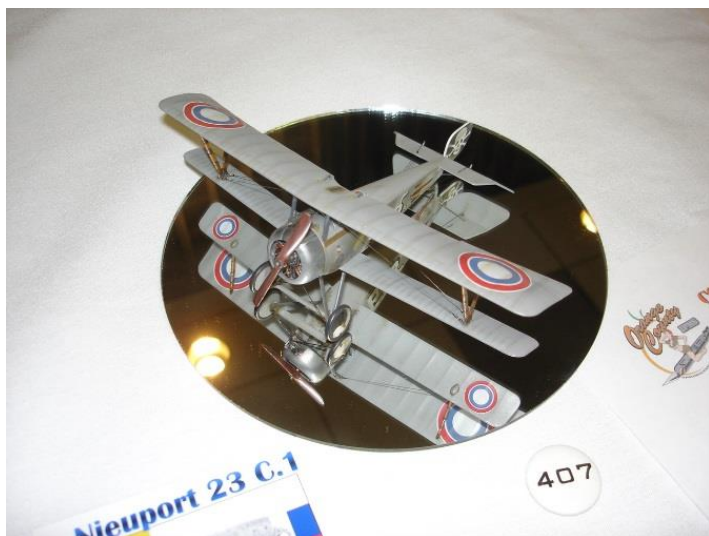

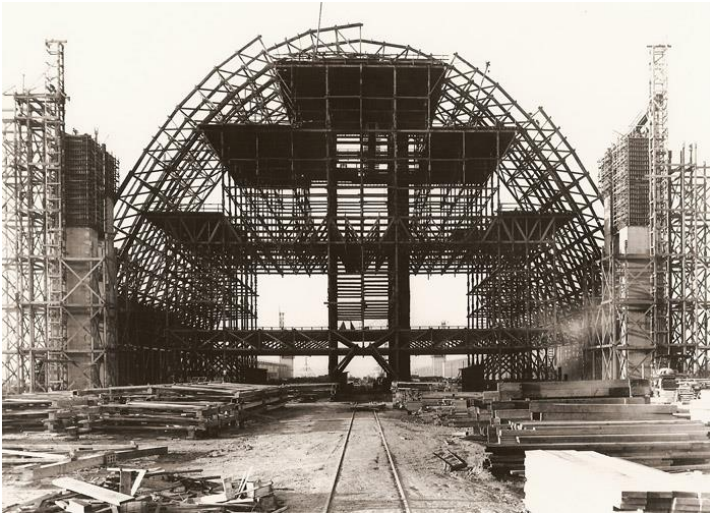

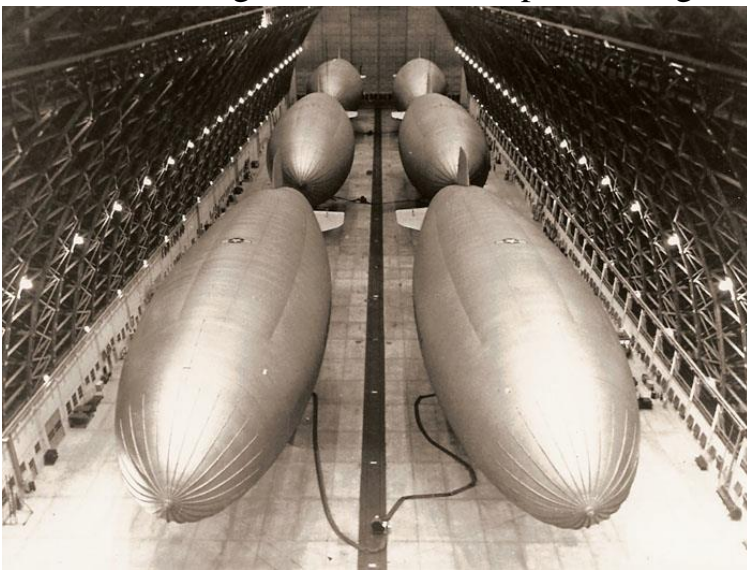


USMC LTA Base, Tustin CA

El Toro MCAS, Irvine CA

El Toro was the best place to watch aircraft training flights. I remember being about 14 years old sitting in the family station wagon while my mother shopped at the food commissary near runway 7L. The parking lot for the commissary was right across the way where F-4B Phantom II's, A-4F Skyhawks, and later F/A-18A, B, C Hornets would taxi to make the left turn onto 7L to prepare to take off. 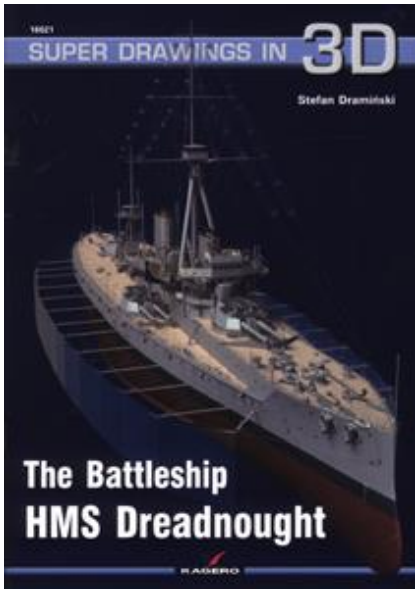

Review – The Battleship HMS Dreadnought

The Dreadnought book is the latest in Kagero's series of illustrated books on famous ships. This book follows the existing series format of 70 pages of color, computer generated renderings in both plan/profile aspects as well as 3D perspective details. The book also

includes a very nice set of black-and-white line drawings of the ship in plan and profile with detail sketches of guns, boats and other details.

The historical significance of HMS Dreadnought is more than just her wartime service, it's the revolution in naval architecture and marine engineering that she pioneered that makes this ship truly historical. Dreadnought served as the prototype of the "All Big-Gun" battleship, carrying more than twice the fire power and able to steam 3 to 5 knots faster than her predecessors, this ship revolutionized the concept of naval warfare and made all preceding ships obsolete. The concepts pioneered by Dreadnought influenced battleship design all the way down the final days of the battleship.

In spite of the impact the design of the Dreadnought had, her service history was remarkably uneventful. Commissioned in 1906 and decommissioned in 1920, she did serve during the First World War, but not in notable battles...though she did ram and sink a U-Boat...making HMS Dreadnought as the only battleship to sink a submarine.

Kagero's book contains only six pages of text. This covers the description of her conception, construction and actual service. The value of this book comes in the more than 125 color illustrations of the ship overall and in close up detail. As previously mentioned, many of the drawings provide a close up look, from a sailor's perspective, of what various pieces of equipment looked like and how it was rigged. These drawings will prove particularly useful to the modeler who is not that familiar with ship's equipment. I was fascinated by the illustration of the emergency conning position right aft on the quarterdeck.

Standing on a raised platform is a compass binnacle, and next to the platform is a hatch which leads, ultimately down to the emergency steering tiller so orders could be shouted down to the men using it to steer the damaged ship...it may have been a “modern steam powered ship” but in emergency they still used equipment little changed since the days of Nelson.

Of special interest to this reviewer are the drawings (one of which is on the cover) of the anti-torpedo nets in deployed and stowed conditions. These help appreciate the web of rigging used to deploy and then stow the nets.

The ships rigging, signal halyards, antennae, boat crane and other rigging is well illustrated. The spider web of rigging is actually easy to understand from studying these drawings. A modeler would be well served to spend time plotting out his rigging strategy early in the build process.

This latest addition to Kagero’s series of books on various ships is well worth the investment for anyone building a model of HMS Dreadnought. There are outstanding kits from both Trumpeter and Zvezda in 1/350th scale and this book will be of great assistance to the builders in detailing, painting and rigging his ship.
