Our club is a chartered chapter of the International Plastic Model Society - U.S. Branch (the IPMS-USA). The EPSMS was first organized in 1969, received its charter in 1970, and has been continuously active since that time.


We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those aged 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchases of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meetings are generally held on the 1 st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2.00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see the map below). In the Blue Angels' early years, the demonstration included a mock dogfight with an all-yellow "enemy" aircraft nicknamed the "Beetle Bomb". This role was originally undertaken by an SNJ but as the Blues transitioned from the F6F Hellcat to the F8F Bearcat, the SNJ was traded for an yellow F8F of the same name. Three F8Fs would perform the maneuvers until the enemy would attack the three Bearcats to begin a dogfight. At this point the forth F8F would join the group that would then split into two two-plane sections to pursue the enemy. The enemy pilot would always lose the fight ending in his aircraft hurdling towards the ground in smoke and a dummy thrown out to represent the pilot bailing out.



Designed to emulate a captured Focke-Wulf Fw 190 and to outperform the Japanese A6M5 Zero, the Grumman F8F Bearcat was first flown on August 21, 1944. This single-engine US Navy aircraft was Grumman's last piston-engined fighter, possessing a number of innovative features including uniquely "detachable wingtips," which would snap off if gforces reached a certain level. Though the Bearcat was considered one of the best-handling piston-engined fighters in history, it didn't become operational after the end of WWII. Still, the Bearcat earned an important place in history through its postwar service with the US Navy and its use by the Blue Angels aerobatic performance team.

Jose Roldan brought in the box a Mobeius model of the "SeaView" from the movie, Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea. This model must be at least 40 inches long Jose also brought a nice 1/200th scale Aurora Godzilla. Jose also had an A6M2-"Zero" built form the Pegasus 1/48th scale kit. As a WIP, Jose had a couple of "War of the World's War Machine tanks.

Clifford Bossie had several models to show. At the local hobby shop on Saturday, he was challenged to purchase a kit and to actually start to build it. Cliff accepted and he had a Revell Tiger II in 1/72nd scale that he started right away and had the track and lower part of the tank assembled and painted. He plans to work on it until finished in a week or 2.

He had an F4F-3 in 1/72nd scale made from the HobbyBoss Yellow Wing release, but he had to do a good of work to convert this to an F4F-3 as the kit is not what is advertised in the box. Cliff has been working on a FB-111A prototype using the Revell kit. Actually Revell has not made an FB-111A so this is an effort of love.



James Coleman was back and he brought a Monogram 1/48th scale TBF-1 Avenger done in the markings of George H. W. Bush. Gloss Sea Blue is good.

He also brought a Legend Magach 7A conversion for the Tamiya M60 hull which the Israeli's used to update their M-60 series tanks.
