WHY JOIN IPMS?

A long time ago, in a galaxy far, far away, back when Squadron was an actual hobby shop and the only US print option for the scale modeler was the mediocre, "Scale Modeler," the IPMS/USA publications were the only link between the modeler and the outside (the closet) world. Today, there is the Internet. So, why be bothered with IPMS/USA? First and foremost is the network of local clubs that afford the modeler the opportunity to commune with likeminded people and show off his/her work. If you take the time (and I have on several occasions) to compare the number of local shows/contests sponsored by IPMS/USA affiliates nationwide to those sponsored by all other organizations/companies-COMBINED-, you will find IPMS/USA sponsors, on average, three times per year as many as all the others, again, COMBINED.



The second reason to join IPMS/USA is the opportunity to have your work published in our bi-monthly publication, the IPMS/USA, "Journal," magazine. "Oh, piffle," as you turn up your nose at our little pedestrian rag. Yeah, right. Just wait for the thrill of seeing your ebullient words of prose, coupled with your Renaissance creation of a model in print. If you've ever had a date with a crush of the opposite sex, it comes a bit close to that. And, while on the topic, just try getting your opus published by some of the mainstream modeling magazines.....good luck.

Another rather excellent reason for joining IPMS/USA and a local club (or creating your own) is the excellent event insurance Mother IPMS/USA provides. 

The Chattanooga Modeler's Society put on another great ModelCon show this past January 10-11. They have been putting on a great show for the past 3-4 years. Each year it seems to get better, particularly since they moved to the Chattanooga Convention Center downtown. I believe this was the largest

show they've hosted. That huge convention room was full. The vendors took up as much space as the show tables.

The Georgia Mountain Modelers were very well represented. If I'm not mistaken, we had 10 members attending and most of these folks brought models to enter. Chuck and Ed took advantage of the Friday afternoon opening and spent the evening sharing stories with follow modelers. All the rest of us arrived Saturday morning and managed to get through the registration process without too much trouble. What a fun day talking to other modelers, shopping the vendors, watching the raffle board, and seeing some really great skill and craftsmanship displayed on a wonderful array of models.

Because of the larger than expected number of models entered, 613, the head judge was looking for volunteers to help with the judging. Ed, Steve, Chuck and myself jumped in to help. The judges were grouped into teams of three and assigned to specific categories. I think this is one of the best ways to learn to be a better modeler. Heaven knows I need to improve the quality of my models. By judging you can see how closely the models are scrutinized and learn what makes a model an "also ran". You also can see what it takes to make a Gold medal winner. If you ever get a chance to help judge and haven't done so, I encourage you to give it a try.

The judges certainly liked what they saw from the GMMers. The results are:

Leo: 2 silvers and 1 bronze

Keith: 1 silver

Steve: 1 silver and 1 bronze

Perry: 4 bronzes

Paul: 2 bronzes

Charlie: 1 gold

Bill R: 4 silvers and 4 bronzes

A big **CONGRATULATIONS** and pats on the backs to all award winners!

This show has the only photo contest of any show I've attended. It's a great way to show off your models other than just sitting them on a table or shelf. I entered the contest with hopes of picking up at least 1 or 2 bronze awards. It wasn't to be. There is obviously an entirely different judging criterion for the photos. Until I learn what the judges are looking for, I'll not enter that contest again. There is too much time involved that I could better spend on plastic.

ModelCon2015 will be here in eleven short months. It's time to start selecting you kits and building a whole new set of models to enter one of the best shows around.

New U.S. Army Rifle



The XM25 Counter Defilade Target Engagement System has a range of roughly 2,300 feet - and is to be deployed in Afghanistan soon. I would call it the "Equalizer." Some call it the "Punisher." The rifle's gun sight uses a laser range finder to determine the exact distance to the obstruction, after which the soldier can add or subtract up to 3 meters from that distance to enable the bullets to clear the barrier and explode above or beside the target. Soldiers will be able to use them to target snipers hidden in trenches rather than calling in air strikes.

The 25-millimeter round contains a chip that receives a radio signal from the gun sight as to the precise distance to the target. Lt. Col. Christopher Lehner, project manager for the system, described the weapon as a 'game-changer' that other nations will try and copy. He expects the Army to buy 12,500 of the XM25 rifles this year, enough for every member of the infantry and special forces.

Lehner told Fox News: "With this weapon system, we take away cover from [enemy targets] forever. Tactics

are going to have to be rewritten. The only thing we can see [enemies] being able to do is run away."

Experts say the rifle means that enemy troops will no longer be safe if they take cover. The XM25 appears to be the perfect weapon for street-to-street fighting that troops in Afghanistan have to engage in, with enemy fighters hiding behind walls and only breaking cover to fire occasionally. The weapon's laser finder would work out how far away the enemy was and then the U.S. Soldier would add one meter using a button near the trigger. When fired, the explosive round would carry exactly one meter past the wall and explode with the force of a hand grenade ABOVE the Taliban fighter.

The army's project manager for new weapons, Douglas Tamilio, said: "This is the first leap-ahead technology for troops that we've been able to develop and deploy." A patent granted to the bullet's maker, Alliant Tech systems, reveals that the chip can determine how far it has traveled. Mr. Tamilio said: "You could shoot a Javelin missile, and it would cost about \$69,000. These rounds will end up costing \$25.00 apiece." They're relatively cheap. Lehner added: "This is a game-changer. The enemy has learned to get cover, for hundreds if not thousands of years. Well, they can't do that anymore. We're taking that cover from them and there are only two outcomes: We're going to get you behind that cover or force you to flee." The rifle will initially use high-explosive rounds, but its makers say that it might later use versions with smaller explosive charges that aim to stun rather than kill.




HISTORY 101


