Our club is a chartered chapter of the International Plastic Model Society - U.S. Branch (the IPMS-USA). The EPSMS was first organized in 1969, received its charter in 1970, and has been continuously active since that time.


We are a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art of scale modeling (regardless of construction media), and membership is open to anyone interested in scale modeling. Club membership dues are payable on an annual basis (we can accept cash or personal checks). Dues are \$15.00 per year for regular members over the age of 16, and are based on a January-December club year. Junior memberships are available for those aged 16 and under, and are priced at \$5.00 per year. Family memberships are available for an extra payment of \$2.00 per year per family member. Members in good standing are entitled to vote in all club matters, run for office, enter club contests, judge in all club contests, and receive a copy of the club's monthly newsletter. Hal's Hobby Warehouse on Bessemer in East El Paso also offers club members a discount on purchases of models and modeling materials. The exact discount is set on a sliding scale. Our club meetings are generally held on the 1 st or 2nd Sunday of each month at 2.00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of St. Paul's United Methodist Church at 7000 Edgemere Blvd (please see the map below). **Mike Boudreaux**'s winners: 1st 1/48 Single Engine Prop non-British, non-Axis: Airfix Spitfire S.31 in Swedish markings, 2nd 1/48 Single Engine Prop non-British, non-Axis: Eduard Yak-3 3rd, 1/48 Multiengine Jet: HobbyCraft YP-59 Airacomet, 2nd 1/72 Softskin AFV: Revell Fennek.

**Mike Boudreaux** was in town recently. Several club members talked to him at Hal's on the usual Saturday morning hang out there. I think I read that several were holding a BeerBQ for Mike. No report on that event, but we can assume it was a great success.

**Fabian Nevarez** gave a nice presentation on masking clear parts with Bare Metal foil.

John Estes showed two methods to mask clear parts using tape and showed three ways to put in clear parts after you have painted the model and how to retrieve the window that might have come loose or unglued when placed in the model as the instructions state.





Jim Davis brought the second section of VF-3, Felix the Cat that was based on the USS Saratoga, CV-3 circa 1931/32, built from the Monogram Boeing F4B-4 kit in 1/72nd scale.

Marco Antonio Landero from Juarez, Mexico brought some very nice items to show. He had a diorama of a PzKw IV that has been captured by Russian troops complete with a girl on a bicycle, and a wrecked horse drawn cart and he called it "EI Brindis, 1943" (A Toast, 1943). Another diorama was a single figure fishing in a stream with a wooden bridge, authentic looking water and stream background behind the fisherman. His third model was a 1 to 9 scale Bust of a Native American woman painted from the Pegasus model. All extremely nice work from the Doctor.

Mike Kennedy had three T-38 kits to show and compare as to detail, length, and stuff like that. He plans to build all three as comparison builds using the Sword kit as a T-38 of the USAF Thunderbirds, the Wolpack boxing in the white training scheme .markings and the Trumpeter in the Holloman AFB black scheme that was used for the F-117 chase planes when training new pilots for



the F-117. Mike also had an F4F as a work in progress. This was the Tamiya 1/48th kit being modified to an FM-1.

**Kai Garcia** had some models that he was designing on his NoteBook. Interesting.

Roger Gutierrez brought an 86 Ford Thunderbird Motorcraft (NASCAR) as a WIP. He also had a 1991 Ford thunderbird Motorcraft (NASCAR) in progress.

Jose Roldan brought a 1/144th scale F-18E "Bravo" from the movie "Planes." Jose has shown a great deal of interest in the new "Godzilla" movie, commenting on the trailer that is available.



### **Show & Tell**

Mike King had four nice 1/72nd models to show. He had a Hobby Boss Sea Hawk FGA-6 in markings for HMS Albion, circa 1956. Mike also had a B5N "Kate" in Pearl Harbor attack markings, and he had a B7A Ryusei (Shooting Star), allied code name "Grace" assigned to the the752nd Naval Air group. Mike's last effort was a TBM-3 of VA-195 Dam busters.

Joe Ureno, one of the original members of our club had a couple of big models as WIPs. One was a

Simply google lone star figure show and click on the link. Schedule and hotel info (its close to the airport), etc... will be found there.




