Review of the Month—1/48 British Quad Bikes from Airfix



Airfix has extended their range of new releases related to British forces in Afghanistan with this kit of Quad Bikes and crew. These are all-terrain vehicles adapted for military use. There are two complete vehicles and their accompanying trailers with four crew members. These are new kits,


and the molding is superb. Given the diminutive size of these vehicles, however, the parts are rather fragile so careful removal from the sprues will be necessary. The kits are molded in that familiar Airfix blue-grey plastic. There's one sprue for the figures, two sprues each for the vehicles and trailers for a total of thirty seven parts. There is a modest decal sheet and colored instructions with 3-D drawings for instructions. As is typical with Airfix kits, the sprues are packed together loosely in a plastic bag which means some loose, and this case, broken parts. Whilst these will look great with the companion Landies, Warrior and Merlin HC.3, possible conversions are almost limitless.



WARNING, entering hard hat zone

New Variant! The third release in this class after the Maryland and West Virginia, the Colorado was the lead ship of the Colorado class of battleships. Her keel was laid down on May 29, 1919. She operated in the vicinity of the Fiji Islands and New Hebrides from November 1942 to September 1943 to prevent further Japanese expansion. She provided pre-invasion bombardment and fire support for the invasion of Tarawa in 1943 and also saw extensive action in the Leyte Gulf, Mariana Islands and Okinawa and was preparing for the invasion of Japan as the war ended. Kit consists of over 610 parts including two OS2U aircraft, display stand and photo-etched parts.
